Early 1990.

- The late Sherwood Greenwell and Kona Historical Society Executive director , Jill Olson recognizing that there were many sites and buildings in Kona of historical significance, launched on a “what can we do” discussion. Since the Kona Historical Society was focused on gathering and archiving information the need to establish another organization to preserve these sites became evident.
- Interested persons assembled to establish Pulama ia Kona Heritage Preservation Council.
- Sites and projects identified—Kuakini Wall, Keakealani Wahine Complex, Ahupuaas, neighborhoods such as Holualoa Village, Kainaliu, and Buildings such as churches.
